Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!

Life is full of juxtapositions. Some of us experience the Advent Season as a time of great expectation and joy, while others among us see only the emptiness and loneliness of the days ahead. The naked hatred that blares at us from multitudinous video screens and handhelds only increases our sense of isolation. Some of us no longer watch or listen to the news or read the newspapers. We turn off and tune out to a world that makes us feel vulnerable, hopeless, and helpless to stay the onslaught of the inhumanity that rages about us.

We are not alone with these feelings. There was a man who daily lived in the midst of similar horrors. He coped with the loneliness, isolation, and injustice that raged about him by offering hope and direction for those among whom he lived. His life changed the face of the world forever. And the offer he made to others is available to you today – even as you read this. You see, his name is Jesus, and he wants to be an active part of your life.

Unlike so many of us, Jesus never tuned out the world around him. He exhibited compassion, love, and patience. He gave his very life that all might come to know peace, hope and a quiet joy amid the chaos of this life. He taught us how we are to live, and how we are to make a difference in this world. If we love as he loves we can quell the hatred that destroys. In the great commission Jesus commanded:

"... go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." Matthew 28:19-20

So, when you feel like tuning out and turning off; when you feel like nothing you do can make a difference in the "big picture" of life; when you feel alone and despairing – do as Jesus did; reach out to someone and live the life Jesus exemplified. I offer you the Prayer of Friar Francis of

to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love:

For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; it is in dying that we are born again to eternal life

Let us walk from darkness into light as we endeavor to live the life that Jesus offers, for Jesus is the light of the world. Come and celebrate his birth with us.




Thank you to everyone who donated can tabs for the Ronald McDonald house at Westchester Medical Center. We reached our goal and filled our container!




