
Dear Friends,

Today was a difficult day for a friend of many in this congregation. She lost a much beloved daughter to an unexpected death. While death is a natural part of life, we refuse to acknowledge that it will come to us all, and the time is not of our choosing. Death feels especially difficult when we lose a child, no matter the age of that child. Our hearts cry out, "this is our child, our touchstone, our lifeline." Nothing makes sense to us; life suddenly becomes out of sync. This particular death feels especially egregious because it has occurred shortly after the death of her son and a brother.

As we waited for the deceased's husband to arrive, the questions "why" - "why did this happen?" resonated throughout the hospital room. "It's not supposed to happen this way, mothers are not supposed to bury their children." As the specter of death and grief played out once more in front of me, it became increasingly clear that there are no words that can remove such a sting. How inadequate are words at such a time!

My heart aches for our friend and her family, and for the spouse and children of the deceased. I silently echo what has been repeatedly whispered by others in the room, "How much more O LORD? How much more can this woman take?" And just as silently he answers, "I am with her. I will support her; she need only ask." "But God," I say, "how can she survive this? It is too horrible - too unfair." And again, he promises, "I am here. Trust me. I am waiting."

What I say to our friend, and to you who bear this pain with her, is this: our God is not the author of death, but the giver of life. He offers us abundant life through him, in this life and the next. God assures us that there is no situation in which we are alone. Jesus has promised, "Look, I myself will be with you until the end of the present age (Matthew 28:20)."

While we struggle to find the answers to life's many hurts, I look into the scripture which strengthens me and teaches the following:

"Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Isaiah 41:10

You may be asking why, when we have had so much death in our congregation, I choose to address this death. I do so because this may be a time when grief has silenced her ability to pray, and we must become her voice and pray for her and her family. While she waits for the LORD, we are admonished to comfort her and support her as we have many others before. "Comfort, comfort my people, says our God." Isaiah 40:1.

- Session met with prospective new members Jeff Begor, Ben and Myung Sung, and Carol Smith and voted to receive them as members. They will be publicly received during worship on January 26.
- 2. Clerk Marilyn Brands presented the preliminary Statistical Report which will be sent to General Assembly. Session approved this report.
- 3. Pastor Shawn proposed that Session update the church By-laws. Copies will be given to elders so they can consider any needed changes. She reported that she is preparing for a communicants' class for ninth and tenth graders.
- 4. Finance Committee Chairperson Dick Walker presented the 2014 Budget. A report of fundraisers in 2013 was presented and possible fundraisers for 2014 were discussed as follows: place mats with advertisements by local businesses, a spaghetti dinner on March 8, May Fest on May 9 and 10, and a chicken barbecue, date yet to be determined.
- 5. Stewardship Chairperson Jerry Conklin presented the Mission Budget for 2014, which was approved by Session. He reported that mission giving is up from last year.
- 6. Worship Committee Chairperson Judy Brandow reviewed Communion servers for February and March.

- 7. Personnel Committee Chairperson Gary Murphy reported that the Committee met and recommends a 2% increase in salary for staff, according to Committee on Ministry guidelines.
- 8. In other business, Marilyn Brands reported on the progress of the Anniversary Committee. Steve Albrecht commented on the success of the Clothing Shed, and Session expressed appreciation to Presbyterian Women for their work on this project and for donating part of the profits to the general budget.

THE HISTORY CORNER

Slavery and the Church

The practice of slavery was common in New York State at the time our local church was established in 1765. Slave ships brought enslaved people, principally from the West Indies, to the Port of New York where they were sold at markets in N.Y. City. Landowners from many states came there to buy. Unlike the plantation economy in the South, Northern slaves worked mainly in home industries, in mills, and as domestics and farmhands on relatively small properties.

Churches of various faiths, mainly Quakers, Methodists and Presbyterians were in the forefront of the Abolition Movement, leading to New York's Gradual Emancipation Act of 1799. This Act stipulated that children born to slave women after July 4, 1799 were to become indentured servants until males reached age 25 and females age 28. The reasoning for this arrangement, encouraged by the Presbyterian Synod, was to provide a certain degree of education and skills for those to be released from bondage.

Many immigrants of various ethnic backgrounds came to America to work as indentured servants because they couldn't afford to pay for their passage or to buy property here. Their duties differed little from those of the slaves except that their servitude ended after a stipulated period of time, usually seven years. Presbyterians were influential in allowing both slaves and indentured servants to move on to regular employment when able. However, many slaves remained in their familiar households and continued to be considered the "property" of the homeowner there.

During the early 1800s, acceptance of Negroes into our church membership was noted as follows: Sept. 26, 1801 "a number of persons taken as members including Sarah, a woman of color." June 20, 1807 "Jack and Dinah, black people." Feb. 18, 1811 "a new member taken was Samuel, a black man belonging to..." (an elder).

The 1830 census listed a total of 75 slaves in the state due to the practice of people bringing slaves with them when they relocated from other areas. practice was outlawed in 1841. effectively bringing involuntary servitude to an end in N.Y. State.




