Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!


My husband and I are at Starbucks assiduously working for our congregations – he studying and I writing the letter for *The PRES*. As I desperately try to gather my thoughts into some form of cohesiveness surrounding conversations encroach upon my concentration. The harder I try not to hear them, the more intrusive they become. (Bob does this all the time – how does he function like this?)

The young man dressed in his natty work uniform behind me is bragging to his female companion about how he has put his "boss" ("that jerk thinks he's going to tell me what to do") in his place. This youngster goes on a long soliloous about the day's events, and how he has made "the man" look small by ignoring his boss' instructions and basically doing what he wants. He has been on the job a week. My inner disdain is beginning to leak through my pores and I get up to freshen my coffee.

There is a well-dressed middle-aged woman sitting at the counter diligently typing away on her laptop, seemingly oblivious to her environs. Not far from her are some young men dressed in very casual apparel who have pulled several chairs around a table so they may converse together. Actually, they look pretty disheveled and unkempt, but in passing them I catch a phrase from Shakespeare and then one of them (obviously a mathematician) quotes Euclid ... suddenly I am in heaven, and wishing I could join in the conversation. It is fun to hear them discussing and bantering about these two great thinkers (a most preferable conversation).

As I continue on my way to the coffee counter Barbara Brown's Taylor's book, *An Altar in the World*, comes to my consciousness and returning to my seat I take a second look at those around me ... an incredibly diverse group of people. Silently I ask for forgiveness as I see the face of the young braggart for the first time. Quite visible are the worry creases in his young forehead, and the shaking hand as he raises a coffee cup to his lips. His visage belies the bravado of his speech, and I wonder if the young woman notices. My earlier irritation dissipates.

The middle-aged woman at the counter has tears streaking her cheeks, and her typing has become halted. The young students' conversation is becoming more animated and their laughter cuts through this "new" awareness with cyclonic potency. Suddenly I view this place of business as another's of God's altars in the world, a place to reverence all of God's creation...the braggart, the disheveled, the oblivious and the pained.

Occasionally God taps me on the shoulder and says, "Look beyond the surface, I am there. Hear me in the noise and the quiet, for I am there. I am everywhere." Shamefaced, for not recognizing the obvious, I bow my head and seek His presence.


I am grateful for God's reminders, although sometimes they catch me off guard. Much like many of you, once the day is planned I am anxious to get moving and fulfill my obligations. Sometimes, when I am caught up in the busyness of the day, I sense a prodding and I hear that inner voice ... "I know you've been busy, but have you taken notice of what is before you? You know, we haven't connected much today. Let's talk." "Speak, Lord. I am listening." Once more He teaches me the meaning of "holy" and shares the sacredness of the ordinary, which surrounds us each day.

Have you taken the time today to notice all of the sacred spaces and people in your life; spaces filled by the Holy that are all around you? Have you spoken to the LORD today, or even taken a moment to slow down and listen for God's voice? Like young Samuel, we all could do well to echo his words:

Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.

Session Update

- Pastor Shawn reported on members who are sick. She will be on vacation May 28 to June 7.
- 2. Clerk Marilyn Brands thanked Gary Murphy for attending Clerks' Day on April 6. Session approved a request for our church to participate in the Pleasant Valley Weekend parade, and gave approval for reupholstering the Communion chairs.
- 3. Members of the Communicants class were present: Aaron Traver, Angelika Wenzel, Evan Palmiotti, Garrett Burnett, Kyle Traver, Layla Kirchhoff, Paige Daley, Shaun Morey, and Zachary Traver. They shared their individual statements of faith and told how they hoped to participate in the life of the church. Session enthusiastically voted these nine young people into membership. They will be publicly received during worship on Maundy Thursday.
- 4. Jean Albrecht was present to explain that a new committee has been formed to run the ecumenical Pleasant Valley Food Pantry. There will be an effort to include more people to help with the food pantry, and a brochure has been proposed to give information about the 4 Pleasant Valley churches. Jean and Edith Keck work at the Food Pantry the second Wednesday of the month. Steve Albrecht, Jerry Conklin, and Don Traver have offered to help transport food.
- 5. Stewardship Committee Chairperson Jerry Conklin reported that the One Great Hour

- of Sharing Offering will be collected through Easter. His committee arranged for publicity of Holy Week services in the newspapers.
- 6. Worship Committee Chairperson Judy Brandow assigned elders for Communion for May and June.

THE HISTORY CORNER

Pews Old and Older

The pews that were recently reinstalled in our sanctuary date from 1905 when stained glass windows were also added in preparation for the church's 140th anniversary. In the 1940s, summer humidity caused the varnish to become sticky, sometimes leaving residue on clothing. Young people who belonged to the Christian Endeavor group at that time led the effort in removing the varnish using a mixture of "Gold Dust Washing Soda," ammonia, hot water and plenty of elbow grease. After the removal was completed, the pews were professionally re-varnished.

These pews replaced the old box style ones that were probably removed from the original church building before its demolition. This type of pew was enclosed, front and back at the base, to keep out drafts. They had a door that latched on the aisle side and were marked with the pew holder's name. The pews were screwed to the wall on each side of the room, with another section in the center, allowing for 2 aisles, rather than the center aisle we have today. There were apparently rows of "open pews" for those not paying the pew tax and therefore not owning a pew.

We are fortunate to have one of the original pew doors, rescued by David Greenwood before it could be discarded.
