Greetings in the name of the LORD Jesus Christ,


With apologies to Charles Dickens:

- 1. Pastor Shawn reported on members who are sick or in the hospital.
- 2. Clerk Marilyn Brands reported that Erika VanDeWater has completed her audit of the Treasurer's books and all is in order. All present expressed their appreciation of the work done by Wayne Sauer and Roland Neumann on church finances. A thank you letter was received from the Harriet Tubman Academic Skills Center for our church's donations to their summer tutoring program.
- 3. Finance Committee Chairperson Dick Walker has resigned from Session due to his move to Montana, planned for November. He stated that he has enjoyed his work on Session and formerly on Trustees. Pastor Shawn and the elders thanked Dick for his dedicated service to this church. Dick reported that he has the budget request forms ready to give out; Wayne Sauer has prepared a new form that should make it easier for committees to plan for next year.
- 4. Stewardship/Church Growth Committee Chairperson Jerry Conklin reported that the stewardship letter has been mailed to members. Pledges will be received on November 2 during worship, with board members presenting their pledges first. The concert by Jim Hendricks was enjoyed by all who attended.
- 5. Personnel Committee Chairperson Gary Murphy reported that Melissa Palestro has resigned as Christian Education Coordinator now that she has full time employment in the Arlington School District. A motion was made by Gary Murphy, seconded by Steve Albrecht, and passed unanimously to accept her resignation with regret and appreciation. Gary will set up a meeting with the Personnel Committee.

- 6. Christian Education Committee Chairperson Karen Haight reported on the committee meeting which dealt with handling the transition after Melissa's resignation. Committee members were assigned to take over some of the tasks of the CE Coordinator. On Columbus Day Gary Murphy and Charlie Traver led the high school class on a hike. There will be a confirmation class this year.
- Worship Committee Chairperson Judy Brandow will have the informational pamphlets for visitors updated for the next meeting, to be reviewed by Session.
- 8. In New Business, new choir robes are being considered. Sue Morey has been researching this.
