Holy Week


Join us to celebrate Holy Week this year!

Resurrection is real!

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, this year on **Sunday, April 14**. We gather at **9:30am** for worship, with a Palm Sunday procession led by our children and Jack the Donkey! We will read the story together all the way from Palms to Passion. Following the service will be an Easter Egg Hunt for the kids!

On Maundy Thursday, this year on **Thursday, April 18**, we'll gather in the Sanctuary at **7pm**. We will celebrate Communion, the Lord's Supper, remembering the Last Supper our Lord had with his disciples in the Upper Room. A Service of Tenebrae ("shadows") follows, as the light slowly leaves the world. It is a powerful service that ends in darkness and silence.

On Good Friday, **Friday, April 19**, the Ecumenical Christian faith community of Pleasant Valley gathers to walk the Stations of the Cross together. We will walk between the four churches in town, stopping briefly at each for the next Station(s.) This service begins at First Presbyterian at **6:30pm**.



The Ecumenical community gathers again on Easter morning, **Sunday, April 21 at 6:30am** for a Sunrise Easter Worship Service at Mill Park.

Then, finally, at **9:30am on Sunday, April 21**, we will gather in our Sanctuary for a **Festival Easter Resurrection Celebration Service**, including senior choir and trumpet, flowers and neighbors and song and joy.

Which worship service or combination of services appeal to you this year? Is there a service that you haven't been to in the past, that you might like to try? Maybe this is the year to walk the journey for the whole week, participating in each one of the different worship opportunities. Session Update

- 1. Pastor Lynn's report of her activities for January and February included Officers Training, 3 meetings with the Mission Study Team, Friendship Callers, home visits, the Palmquist funeral, and meeting with elders to discuss the revision of By-Laws.
- 2. Session committees were reorganized as follows: Christian Education, Chesney Baker; Deacons liaison, Hope Murphy; Finance, Gary Murphy and Helen Traver; Nominating, Judy Brandow; Personnel, Bill Miller and Gary Murphy; Stewardship/Church Growth, Edith Keck and Myung Sung; Trustees liaison, Pastor Lynn; Worship, Karen Sheer and Hope Murphy; Communications and Technology, James Sawner.
- 3. Under Transition Update, several elders had attended a Mission Study Team meeting on March 13 to hear a presentation on the Church Assessment Tool. Chesney Baker and Bill Miller reported on this meeting.
- 4. Final changes were made to the By-Laws of the Congregation; this document was approved by the Session. A special congregational meeting has been called for March 31 for the congregation to discuss and approve the updated By-Laws. Printed copies will be available on March 24.
- 5. Communion servers were assigned for April, May, and June.
- 6. Christian Education Chairperson Chesney Baker reported that the Easter Craft evening, sponsored by CE and PW, will take place on March 22. Children will remain in the sanctuary on March 24 to be present for the entire service and make Easter cards for shut ins. Children will participate in Palm Sunday with the processional and an Easter egg hunt.
- 7. Session approved June 8 for the Chicken Barbecue fundraiser.
- 8. Session will have a special meeting on Sunday, April 14, at 8:30 a.m. to receive new members who will be publicly received during worship.

HOMELESS SHELTER MEAL

Presbyterian Women prepare and deliver a meal for the Homeless Shelter six times a year; on the second Tuesday of February, April, June, August, October and December. The meal is a chicken/vegetable casserole, fresh green salad and homemade or store bought cookies. Approximately 55-60 people are fed at the shelter each night and during the colder months 70-80.

The church has helped the Homeless Shelter for many years by preparing this meal and for several years helping to serve it also. All the items needed for the meal are donated by church members or purchased with funds given for this purpose. There is typically a group of 6-7 that meet in the kitchen at 4:00 p.m. on the day of the meal to prepare it. When we helped to serve the meal we needed 4 people to make that work efficiently. At this time we are only delivering the meal to the facility and the staff there serves it.

A signup sheet to contribute to this cause is located on the table in the Husted Fellowship Hall. For each meal we need cooked chicken, frozen vegetables, canned cream of chicken and mushroom soups, chicken broth, for the salad – lettuce and other veggies (onion, cucumbers, shredded carrot, etc.) and ranch dressing (they love ranch dressing!). We make up packages of cookies for dessert and need 16-17 dozen cookies each time. Please consider providing 1-2 dozen cookies or salad items a few times a year to help with this cause. Donated items must be in the church kitchen no later than noon of the day of meal. Thank you for your continuing generosity in helping those in need. Any questions please see Linda Morey.

THE LUNCH BOX

The Lunch Box is a community meal program, providing a hot lunch and dinner Monday- Friday and a hot lunch on weekends for anyone who needs one within Dutchess County. Open each day and on most holidays to ensure that all Poughkeepsie residents are able to enjoy a decent hot meal. They are committed to serving complete, nutritious meals for all individuals, sourcing a majority of their ingredients from their own urban farms and other local Hudson Valley farms.

On average they serve over 300 meals daily. Last year they served over 83,000 meals. Volunteers include Marist students, Vassar students, CIA students who help to cook the meals, athletes and clubs, local residents and churches, and more that help to procure, prep, cook and serve meals.

Each month this church collects the ingredients needed to prepare a meal of ziti and meat sauce. We deliver the ingredients on the second Sunday each month to the Family Partnership building in Poughkeepsie where the Lunch Box is located. Our contribution helps to feed up to 120 people a nutritious hot meal. Members of the congregation donate the ingredients once a month and have done so faithfully for many years. We receive monetary contributions on occasion, these help to purchase items if needed. Any questions on this program please see Karen Haight.
