Dear Friends,

Interim Ministry is a funny thing. When a pastor leaves after a long pastorate, the Presbytery often advises a church to engage the services of an interim minister to walk alongside them while the search for the next permanent minister unfolds. That is the work I have been engaged in with you over the past 14 months and hope to continue with you well into 2020.

The Presbytery provides a form for the Search Committee to prepare for the Interim Pastor search. The committee that brought me here to Pleasant Valley wrote the following in their search document:

We desire to have an Interim Pastor who will help us analyze these areas, and determine what resistance/barriers might be holding us back.

In all areas, we need to risk change while also celebrating and building on our heritage.

As I look back on our year+ of ministry together, I see many areas where we are

"risking change while also celebrating and building." Let me list a few:



- The Nominating Committee is asking folks about serving second terms because of the recent change in our by-laws that allows for that. Many who have been asked have expressed reservations that they should instead step aside for someone else to serve. There are few others to ask. Change is hard.
- The group of children we regularly see in worship this year range from 6 months to 3 years. We only occasionally have an older child or two. We've committed this year to including our littles in our worship space and are trying to address the issues that are arising from that commitment. Change is hard.
- I continue to hear feedback that people would like for me to be in my office more of the time. This is a big change for all churches and one that is only going to continue in the future: you can expect that any pastor you call will likely work some from home and have office hours in the local coffee shop. They should not be spending time sitting in the church building but instead be out and about in the community. Change is hard.
- We continue trying different styles of music and adding more music to our already music-rich worship services. We want to include more contemporary-sounding music but still value our rich musical heritage and our traditional choir. Change is hard.

Change is neither good or bad, it simply is.

Change **IS** hard and tiring. How are you managing the stress of change, both in your own life or, here, in our common church life? Where do you see possibilities for risking change? What resistance or barriers are holding us back?

Part of the work of the interim time in a congregation is to take a hard look at "how we've always done things" and see where good change might be called for. Change is hard. Hang in there! God is with us. Merry Christmas!


