

Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!

We are embarking on one of the most breathtaking seasons of the Christian year – Advent – the time of preparation for the **CELEBRATION** and **JOY** of Christ's birth. Over the next few weeks, as a church, we will journey with Mary, Joseph, Zechariah, Elizabeth and the people of the first century as they go about their daily lives; lives filled with many of the same stressors we experience – corrupt politicians, taxes, economic hardships, ill health, road trips, and a hope for peace and a better life.

Concomitantly we will journey with friends and neighbors who share the same concerns as our first century counterparts, but who live in a society that has trivialized and secularized Christmas. I ache to say his name aloud – not just from the pulpit but also in public places. I would like to see Christmas images alongside other faith traditions, so Christ may become known to others. And while I long for Christ's reemergence in public I am ever more concerned that he find his way back into our Christian lives on a daily basis.

Not only does the secular world revel in this current adaptation of Advent and Christmas, but we Christians get caught up in the fervor too. In the midst of the rat race of shopping, partying and preparations for family gatherings let us ask ourselves, "Where is Christ?" Where is Christ in my family's preparations for Christmas? Does our family ever really talk about Christ and the true meaning of Christmas, or is that a little too uncomfortable? Is it unexplored family territory? Is it just a little too religious?

Friends, I implore you to reclaim for yourselves and your families the meaning of Advent and Christmas. Advent is a journey toward joy – a journey culminating on Christmas Eve with the ecstatic realization that deliverance is at hand — *the beloved* — *the Christ* — *the Savior of the world* — has come! Hope has arrived. As people of faith, let these next few weeks become a time of growing excitement in anticipation of the

greatest gift ever received; God's gift to the world, Jesus, the Christ. Let our Christmas Eve and Christmas day begin and end with the realization and *joy* that Christ is alive with us now and forever!

I really look forward to the coming weeks as together we rediscover the joy of Christmas. Putting aside all political correctness . . . Dare I say it ?!?

Session Update

- 1. Pastor Shawn reported that there will be an ecumenical Thanksgiving service in our sanctuary on November 22. A request has been made for the baptism of Caden Baker on December 10; this request was approved.
- 2. Finance Committee Chairperson Roland Neumann asked that all committee chairpersons return their Budget Request forms as soon as possible so that his committee can begin work on the 2018 Budget.
- 3. Personnel Committee Chairperson Gary Murphy reported that the Personnel Committee has recommended no increase in salaries for staff this year, due to financial concerns. Session voted to approve this recommendation. Gary reported that Pastor Shawn's last Sunday will be February 11, with her last day in the office on February 17. Session approved reimbursing her for 6 weeks of unused study leave and 2 weeks of unused vacation.
- 4. Stewardship Committee Chairperson Edith Keck reported that the Disaster Relief funds collected for hurricane victims have been sent to Presbytery. The total was \$1461.
- 5. Worship Committee Chairperson Phyllis Menzenski assigned Communion servers for December.
- 6. In New Business, Pastor Shawn reported that the Committee on Ministry will be meeting in late November to act on her retirement. After discussion, Session voted to form a committee of 5 people from Session and the congregation to seek an Interim Pastor when Presbytery indicates that it is time to take that step.
- 7. President of Trustees, Debbie Traver was present to inform the Session of the work being done by Trustees on the water purification system, cottage repairs, seeking rentals to increase income, and updating of the By-Laws of the Trustees. Those present expressed their appreciation for Debbie's informative report, and for the hard work of the Board of Trustees.




