Greetings in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ!



HISTORY



THE HISTORY CORNER By Joan Traver

The Chester Husted <u>Fellowship Hall</u>

When our education building was completed in 1957, the hall was named in honor of Chester Husted for his many years of service as teacher, organist and church officer. The following tribute to Mr. Husted, written by John W. Cavo, Clerk of Session at the time, was given at the dedication:

"Chester Husted was a life-long member of our church. Along with many other church interests, he taught in the Sunday School, was church treasurer and played the organ for about 25 years. He was a leader of the young people's group and had for all ... the golden gift of friendship. We have often spoken of his generosity, his faithfulness to duty, his easy but serious assumption of responsibility and his many other rock-bound virtues.


He lived close to the beauty of the earth. Walking on a Sunday afternoon, how his long legs could cover the ground! Every morning he worked his garden and then took a quick dip in the creek before going to his office. In the spring he would be the first one up the creek in his canoe. During the summer, Chet, tanned like an Indian, soaking up sunshine, was a familiar figure in his canoe.

His law business kept him firmly in the midst of the commercial world. In spite of material success, he never lost the common touch, the earthy touch, the human touch. Pomp, ceremony and frills meant little to him. His was a free spirit and along with a warm, compassionate heart, there was enough of the native granite and hickory of his own fields in his being to make the composite, someone we loved and respected and after whom we are glad and proud to name our fellowship hall."

Later, Pastor Robert Agnew would say, "There still hovers over this church an unwholesome influence from the past which cannot equate joy, laughter and dancing with Christian faith. The young people should be permitted to use the new building for wholesome social activities." It might be considered a historic event for the church that on March 20, 1957, Session gave the Jr. High Fellowship permission to hold a dance in the Fellowship Hall. Contrary to many of his ancestors, Chester Husted would have applauded that decision!


Sunday School students are learning about what Lent means, and will be preparing to participate in the Palm Sunday service on March 29th!


