- 2. Clerk Marilyn Brands reported on the meeting of the Auction Committee. Session approved having the Holiday Auction on Saturday, November 19, 2016.
- 3. Personnel Committee Chairperson Mary Jane Gardner read the letter of resignation from Christian Education Coordinator Dara Brands, effective September 30, 2016. Dara has enjoyed her time in this position and will be available to assist the new Coordinator. Her resignation was accepted with regret.
- 4. Stewardship/Church Growth Committee member Karen Haight suggested that Stewardship funds designated for Mission should be donated to Louisiana to help with recovery from the flooding there, with the amount left to the Stewardship Committee to decide. Session approved this suggestion. Pastor Shawn showed a post card template suggested by Lisa Wendell, which would be available at church events, so that people could request notification of church dinners, etc.; this was approved by Session.
- 5. Technology Chairperson Ken Brands reported that he had received a thank you for blankets donated by our church, from VBS last year. He will help with publicity for the Holiday Auction through the web site.

In the past week, catastrophic flooding has covered many of the Gulf states, especially in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, parts of Mississippi, and parts of Texas, damaging tens of thousands of homes.
